Legal Advice and Intake Clinics

Who can attend?

The evening legal clinics are for low-income people who wish to apply for free legal services through Texas Rio Grande Legal Aid and Volunteer Legal Services (VLS).

No criminal or immigration matters are accepted.

What time?

6 p.m. to 7 p.m. (except for school holidays)

Sign in between 6 p.m. and 7 p.m. You will *not* be seen that evening if you sign in *after* 7 p.m.

The clinics are closed during the AISD Winter Break, the AISD Spring Break, some federal holidays and periods during the summer.

Please call Texas Rio Grande Legal Aid to confirm that the clinic is open. (512) 374-2700 or (800) 369-9270 Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Where?

The clinics are held at Martin Junior High School on Monday evenings and at Webb Middle School on Wednesday evenings.

How does it work?

At the clinic, you complete an application and meet with a volunteer attorney to discuss your legal problem.

Legal Aid will review your application to determine if you qualify for help from Legal Aid or VLS.

- Spanish language interpreters are available.
- A sign language interpreter is available on the first Monday clinic of each month or the second Monday if the first Monday is a holiday.
- Please don't bring children to the clinic if you can help it. Child care is limited.

Monday Evenings

Martin Junior High, 1601 Haskell Street

From IH 35, take the Cesar Chavez exit. Drive 5 blocks east on Cesar Chavez (also called East 1st) to Comal Street. Drive south on Comal 5 blocks to Haskell Street.

The school is at the corner of Comal & Haskell.



Wednesday Evenings

Webb Middle School, 601 East St. Johns

From IH 35, take the St. Johns exit. Drive west on St. Johns one block. The school will be on your left.
